The Famous Tobacco Barn Antique Show was held in late September annually from 1959 until 1998. It was located in tobacco warehouses in Upper Marlboro, Maryland. St. Thomas' Parish sponsored the event and ran the dining area. The event ended when the last warehouse closed.

Now eleven and a half years later, we at St. Thomas' Parish are happy to sponsor this renewed antique show at Oxon Hill Manor.

There are many differences between the old and new shows. The new show has less space and fewer dealers, but we hope the genteel



Oxon Hill Manor, a stately 49-room Neo-Georgian style brick mansion, is located in one of the most spectacular settings in Prince George's County.

The entrance doors to the mansion lead to a grand foyer with black and white marble floors. Adjoining the foyer are three spacious rooms with wooden floors and exquisite architectural appointments.

The manor's beautifully landscaped grounds include formal English gardens and a reflecting pool bordered by rose bushes.

The new show will still have a diverse group of quality antique dealers. 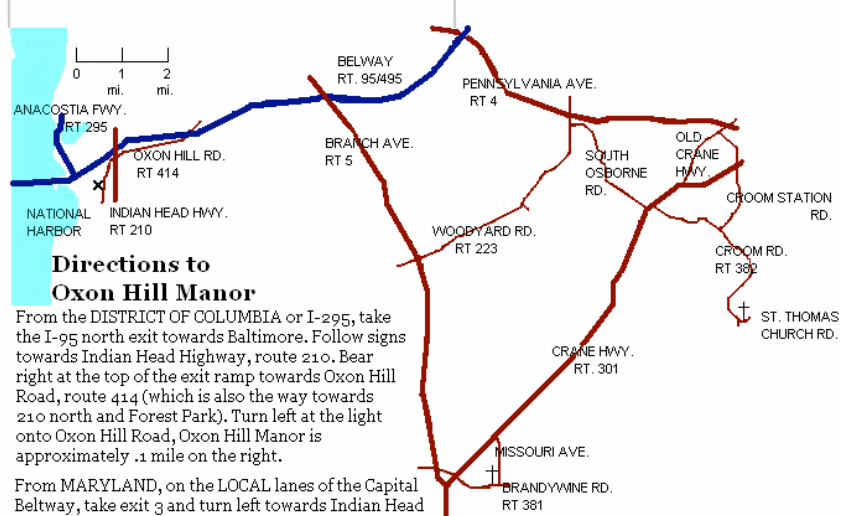


St. Thomas' Parish Croom is an historic parish of colonial origin. The first service at St. Thomas' was on Christmas day 1745.

St. Thomas' Parish came under the jurisdiction of the Diocese of Washington in 1895. Prior to that time the parish was under the jurisdiction of the Diocese of Maryland.

Directions to Oxon Hill Manor

From the DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA or I-295, take the I-95 north exit towards Baltimore. Follow signs towards Indian Head Highway, route 210. Bear right at the top of the exit ramp towards Oxon Hill Road, route 414 (which is also the way towards 210 north and Forest Park). Turn left at the light onto Oxon Hill Road, Oxon Hill Manor is approximately .1 mile on the right.

From MARYLAND, on the LOCAL lanes of the Capital Beltway, take exit 3 and turn left towards Indian Head Highway South, route 210. Bear right at the first split and go left at the light onto Oxon Hill Road, route 414. Oxon Hill Manor is approximately .5 mile on the right.

From VIRGINIA, cross the Woodrow Wilson bridge on the LOCAL lanes. Take exit 3 towards Indian Head Highway South, route 210. The ramp merges with the ramp from I-295, follow directions above from the District of Columbia.
