

Sermon Series, Late Pentecost 2011

For the last four weeks of Pentecost, I wanted to focus, liturgically, on creation and our role in it. We used Eucharistic Prayer C. Dan Dufford, our Director of Music, searched for music that tied with the creation-related theme for each week. And I wanted to write sermons that would relate to one another *and* the overarching theme of creation, not to mention the Revised Common Lectionary readings for those weeks, which included All Saints' Day and Christ the King Sunday.

The result was a series of four story-sermons about Jesus and his niece. No, I don't know if Jesus really had a niece, I am not privy to such information; but I imagine he probably had at least one, and if she had anything in common with her grandmother Mary, she loved God and was a strong and thoughtful young woman. The story-sermons just kind of wrote themselves and I tried to stay out of the way.
